Community:

Salem, Oregon's capital, is the third largest city in the state, with a population of 165,363. Salem is situated in the center of the Willamette Valley 47 miles south of Portland and 64 miles north of Eugene. State government is the largest employer with approximately 13,000 full-time employees.

Sprague High School is one of six comprehensive high schools in the Salem-Keizer School District. The school population is drawn from a suburban-residential area representing a cross section of the Salem community. Sprague High School's student's identify as 68% White, 17% Hispanic, 4% Asian, 1% African/American, and 9% Native American Indian and other minority students.

Schedule Sprague is on a modified block schedule with 8 periods on Mondays, periods 1 through 4 on Tuesdays/Thursdays, and periods 5 through 8 on Wednesdays/Fridays. The year is divided into 2 18-week semesters.
